

## Biography – Milton Wilfred Grenfell



Milton Grenfell founded Grenfell Architecture in 1986.

Committed to practicing in the Great Tradition of Western architecture and urbanism, Grenfell maintains an active practice encompassing design from town centers to fireplace mantels.

Grenfell frequently lectures and serves on professional panels. His work is published in various periodicals and journals, including *Building Classical: A Vision of Europe and America*, *Southern Style*, and *A Decade of Art & Architecture 1992 – 2002*. His projects have been exhibited internationally.

In 1997 he received Classical America's Arthur Ross Award for "mature work (which) has exhibited a continued excellence and integrity of its application of classical ideals and canons."

Grenfell is active in architectural preservation, the Institute of Classical Architecture and Classical America, and the Congress of New Urbanism. He is currently at work designing an extension to the eighteenth century colonial capital of Edenton, North Carolina, various buildings for new traditional neighborhoods; as well as single-family homes from New York to Mississippi.

Grenfell holds a Bachelor of Arts from Williams College and a Masters of Architecture from Washington University in St. Louis.
