

Biography – Andrew Sorokowski, PhD



By training Andrew Sorokowski is both a historian and a lawyer.

His studies included a bachelor's degree in history and comparative literature at the University of California, Berkeley. He received a master's in Regional Studies (Soviet Union) at Harvard University. He earned his JD at the University of California, Hastings College of the Law, including a summer session on International and Comparative Law in Paris. His Ph.D. studies in history were at the University of London School of Slavonic and East European Studies, where he wrote a dissertation on the Ukrainian Greek-Catholic clergy.

He taught history at St. Basil College in Stamford, Connecticut; at the University of Massachusetts in Boston and Lowell; and at Assumption College, Worcester, Massachusetts. In the summer of 2000 he taught Ukrainian church history at Holy Dormition Monastery at University, Ukraine, at a summer session co-sponsored by the Ukrainian Catholic University and St. Paul University, Ottawa. During his doctoral studies he spent a year in Rome working in the chancery of the Lviv Archeparchy as a historian and archivist for Cardinal Myroslav Ivan Lubachivsky.

Currently he is a historical research and information specialist with the US Department of Justice, Environment and Natural Resources Division, Environmental Defense Section, Washington, DC, researching the 20th-century U.S. war industry.

Andrew Sorokowski was born in Hartford, Connecticut and grew up in San Francisco. He is a Ukrainian Catholic, is married with one son and lives in Rockville, Maryland.
